

The Path to World War II Plays Out At An All-Girls Boarding School In Inconceivable Theatre's "Another Caesar"

The conflicts and causes that helped lead to the second World War come alive in the midst of an all-girls boarding school production of "Julius Caesar" when Inconceivable Theatre brings a workshop production of "Another Caesar" to the stage this February.

Written by Inconceivable Theatre Artistic Director Joe Lehman and Co-directed by Lehman and Tony Dobrowski, "Another Caesar" tells the story of a history professor who confronts a dictator poised to turn Germany's destiny to his will. Does the professor's quest for the greater good justify betrayal or will it become his downfall?

"Our show takes themes of betrayal and loyalty explored in Shakespeare's 'Julius Caesar,' and hurls them into a new historical context," said Lehman. "I think audiences will enjoy fresh insights into a classic work while being swept into an original story of love, betrayal and the consequences of doing right."

"Another Caesar" runs Feb. 5-6 and Feb 12-13 at 8 p.m., and Feb. 8 at 7 p.m. at The Chicago Center for the Performing Arts, 777 N. Green St., Chicago. A performance Feb. 16 at 7:30 p.m. will take place at the Illinois Theatre Center, 371 Artists' Walk, in Park Forest. Tickets are \$12 for general admission or \$10 for industry, seniors, veterans and students. Please note the proceeds from their Feb. 6 performance will be donated to Amnesty International.
